

ANNUAL REVIEW 2022/23

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

Never has the work and mission of Asylum Welcome been more important than it is now. 2022/23 has been our busiest year ever – we have faced unprecedented global and national challenges that have reinforced the need for a charity like ours.

We have worked hard to develop our services to respond to the growing demand across Oxfordshire. We called together organisations (including councils and community groups) and staff to mobilise support for the 2,000+ Ukrainians who have been housed across Oxfordshire. We proactively developed a timely outreach service in response to the 700+ asylum seekers being housed in hotels across the county. Alongside these unplanned developments, we continued to support the Afghans who were suddenly evacuated in 2021. Oxfordshire also became an official dispersal area for the first time, contributing to the increased pressure on *all* of our services.

In this Annual Review, you can read stories written by our inspiring clients who we have had the enormous privilege of working with this year. Thanks to the dedication and hard work of our incredible staff, volunteers and supporters like you, they can face the future more hopefully.











JACK'S STORY

HOTEL OUTREACH CLIENT

My name is Jack; I came to the UK from Myanmar. When I came to Oxford, I was placed in hotel accommodation for asylum seekers. I sought help from many different places and didn't get any. I came across Asylum Welcome, and they immediately helped me. They assisted me with legal support, clothes, and transport. As a musician, I desperately needed a guitar. They got me a donated guitar, helping me to improve my musical skills and distract me from thinking about home.

I also volunteer with Asylum Welcome, helping to reduce my stress and concerns about home, practise my English and give me great skills for the future. Asylum Welcome is the world for a man like me because without their help I would have struggled to cope in a country like the United Kingdom, which is completely different from my country.

SCHOOLS ADVOCACY CLIENTS

My name is Fazal, I arrived in the UK from Afghanistan in August 2021 with my wife and five children. We have received continuous support from the Schools Advocacy Programme for all my children. I have been attending weekly meetings where I can raise the issues my children face regarding their technical and educational needs.

My children actively participate in their classes, they now have laptops, and continue to attend English Language classes. I have seen a significant change in my children's confidence. My children are my heroes, all of them have achieved recognition certificates in their schools and have high attendance rates. Seeing such improvement and achievement without the help of Asylum Welcome would be impossible – my family feels lucky that we have been served by such friendly committed people.

UKRAINE PROGRAMME CLIENTS

We arrived in England in August 2022 after Russian missile strikes destroyed our home in the Severnaya Saltovka district of Kharkiv city. Our own home was completely destroyed by shelling. At the age of 62, we had lost everything; our home, business, loved ones, books and all other personal items which made our world happy and fulfilled. **Asylum Welcome's support** was timely and necessary, a lifeline for us.

Their team helped us to integrate into the UK and solved many important issues: they got us free SIM cards, laptops for online classes, helped us with English translation at important emergency GP and hospital visits, organised employment courses, helped us to write our CVs and assisted with finding us somewhere to rent. SANCTUARY HOSTING ADMINISTRATOR & FORMER CLIENT

I first came to Oxford in 2020, waiting for my asylum decision whilst going into the second national lockdown. Luckily, I found Asylum Welcome; they made me feel reassured and hopeful despite the pessimistic national attitude. Months later, I was so inspired by their support, I wanted to volunteer with them in the Welcome Centre. Days after starting, my asylum claim was accepted and the joy I saw on the faces of my caseworkers, fellow volunteers and clients was beyond words. I realised at that moment that I belonged to a family. I soon became a member of staff, working first as a fundraising assistant and then as an administrator at Sanctuary Hosting, which had opened its doors to me when I was facing homelessness. Life had come full circle - I was working alongside Eden, our service coordinator, who had once been my support worker.



Asylum Welcome's income across 2022/23 increased by 45% in comparison to 2021/22, reaching £1,827,295. Our reported income of £2,015,552 includes the transfer of Sanctuary Hosting's reserves (£188.257) following our merger. Our expenditure rose by 66% (£703,000) ending the year at £1,770,620 in total.
