How to leave Asylum Welcome a gift in your Will

Making a Will is the only way you can be sure that your wishes are understood. It is usually a quick, simple and inexpensive process that ensures that the people and causes you care about are well looked after.

If you already have a Will and are thinking about leaving a gift to Asylum Welcome, you can add a codicil (a short document that is added to your Will). The best thing to do is to speak to your solicitor who will advise you on how to create or amend an existing Will. They can also explain how leaving a gift to charity may reduce inheritance tax on your estate.

If you decide to leave a gift to Asylum Welcome in your Will, you can be sure it will be used effectively to provide asylum seekers, refugees and vulnerable migrants with the support they need to build a safe and secure new life. We receive all gifts with sensitivity and efficiency, making sure administration costs are kept to an absolute minimum. Without supporters like you, our work would not be possible.

All you need to do is contact your solicitor and your Will can be updated in minutes. Thank you for considering this lasting gift.
